### RESTORATIVE JUSTICE

**Bexley CPEG investigated the provisions for Restorative Justice in Bexley and asked Charlotte Shrimpton from the Bexley Youth Offending Team (YOT) to give a presentation at our last public meeting 21st November.**

Young offenders in the borough are offered the chance to acknowledge their crime, make good the harm done to a victim and hopefully will not offend again. This has to be victim led and it gives the victim a voice. This can be a face to face meeting or writing a letter. If the victim does not wish to meet the offender there are ways of helping the offender make amends. The courts recognise the need for offenders to make amends on a statutory basis through reparation. The probation service call it *Community Payback*.

Restorative justice conferences are carried out with trained practitioners and the YOT will train community panels, teachers in schools and police to ensure the facility is used as widely as possible although take up is low by victims at present.

Gary Redding from the Youth Action Diversity Trust (YADT)

explained the trust organise many clubs with preventative ideas. They take on 14-17 year olds at the North Cray Community Centre and Parkside Community Centre. They engage with the young offenders and provide suitable work for them to carry out for their Community Payback order.

The young offender is expected to attend on time, at times laid down by the YADT with educational needs being the only concession. Work could consist maintaining gardens, repair work or cleaning, is always supervised and must be of a satisfactory standard. Chief Inspector Tony Gowen spoke of the good work achieved by the YOT working closely with the police. The YOT report to the London Criminal Justice Board and figures prove that young people have not reoffended once they have been dealt with by Charlotte's team. There is little provision for restorative justice for adults in the borough but there are pilot projects ongoing in other boroughs in London which may come to Bexley in due course.

The Probation Service are also planning for the future, a service to work with prisoners prior to release back into the

borough, with a view to meeting the needs of the victim.
